4 tips to start using your Anthem Student Health Insurance Plan

Ready to get started?

You've got enough on your plate with classes and other school activities, so we'll make it easy to use your health plan.

1. Download the free StudentHealth app.

- Search for **StudentHealth** in the App Store® or Google Play™. (It's all one word, no spaces.)
- Download it and tap **Register Now**.
- Enter your first name, last name, **Student ID** and date of birth. (First name is limited to 16 characters and last name to 12 characters.)
- Create a username and password. Your password requires at least 6 characters with a letter and number.



2. Check out your Anthem ID card. Any place you get care will ask to see it.

- Open the **StudentHealth** app.
- Tap **ID Cards**.
- View ID cards for your medical, dental and/or vision, depending on your plan type. They show your name, effective date and any copayments or coinsurance you need to pay when you get care.
- Want a paper copy? Your ID card is mailed to the address in your school file, so check your mailbox.

3. Pick a provider for care.

- Open the **StudentHealth** app.
- Tap the menu (three lines) in the upper left corner.
- Scroll to *Find & Compare*. Then,
 - To find a doctor: search by first name, last name and specialty. Tap **Done**. You'll see a map of nearby doctors.
 - To find a hospital: filter your results by patient ratings, surgical procedures, and more.
 - To find an urgent care center: review the closest urgent care centers on the map to help you choose.
- Tap the name to learn more about any providers.
- Call ahead of time, when you can. Ask if the provider is in your plan and if services you need are covered. This can help you avoid paying more.

4. Understand what your health care summary means.

After you get care, we send you a health care summary or explanation of benefits (EOB). It's not a bill. Think of it as a synopsis of your recent care. It includes:

- Claims summary — how much it cost for your care and how much of that you need to pay.
- Claims details page — a breakdown of the copay, deductible, and other amounts.
- Year-to-date summary — how much is left until you reach your deductible and out-of-pocket maximum.
- Preventive care reminders — a list of screenings, checkups, lab tests or vaccines to be your healthy best.
- Tips and tools — how to save on costs and make the most of your plan.

Your StudentHealth app lets your health plan go with you, when you need it, where you need it. And, there's no final exam!
