Student Coverage

Eligibility Definition

All New York Film Academy degree and long-term certificate program students are eligible to enroll in the New York Film Academy Student Health Insurance Plan (NYFASHIP).

Enrollment

Eligible New York Film Academy students are automatically enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan at the time their program acceptance is confirmed and processed. Students will be billed for their first term of health insurance coverage at the time they receive notification of program acceptance and, for those students choosing to remain enrolled in NYFASHIP, prior to each term enrollment period. The start and end dates of each term enrollment period is noted above.

Students who do not wish to participate in the NYFA Student Health Insurance Plan can request to waive enrollment by participating in the online waiver application process and submitting proof of comparable health insurance coverage. Students may request to waive out of NYFASHIP at the time of their first semester registration and at the time of every subsequent Fall semester registration. Waiver applications must be submitted on or before the deadline dates published above. Waiver applications will not be accepted or processed outside of the time period when the waiver application portal is open.

Those students who submit proof of comparable insurance coverage through their timely participation in the waiver application process will be dis-enrolled from the NYFA Student Health Insurance Plan (NYFASHIP) and costs associated with coverage in NYFASHIP will be removed or refunded.

At 31 days from the program start date (New Students) or Fall Term start date (Continuing Students), students who did not participate in the waiver application process and students whose waiver applications were denied will be enrolled in NYFASHIP for the full 2024/2025 academic year or what remains of the 2024/2025 academic year (for new students beginning their programs in Spring and Summer) and responsible for payment of insurance premiums billed each term of coverage (fall, spring, and summer). Students will not be eligible for refunds. However, students withdrawing from their programs or graduating from the programs before the end of the 2024/2025 academic year will not be billed for health insurance coverage fees for semesters/terms subsequent to their withdrawal or graduation dates

Dependent Coverage

Covered students may also enroll their lawful spouse, including same-sex marriage, domestic partner and dependent children up to the age of 26. OPT Student Coverage

Optional Practical Training (OPT) is a U.S. Immigration term that refers to temporary employment for practical training (work) directly related to the student's major area of study. International Students at NYFA are eligible for Post-Completion OPT which takes place *after* you complete a one- or two-year conservatory program or AFA/BFA/MFA degree program (short term workshops are not eligible for OPT). Once you are eligible to apply for OPT (toward the end of your last semester) the International Student Office will assist you with the application process and advise you on the various rules and regulations related to OPT.

Special Enrollment Periods

The New York Film Academy - NYC Campus 2024-2025

You (if you are an eligible student as defined above), your spouse or child can also enroll for coverage within 60 days of the loss of coverage in a health plan if coverage was terminated because you (if you are an eligible student as defined above), your spouse or child are no longer eligible for coverage under the other health plan due to:

- · Termination of employment;
- · Termination of the other health plan;
- Death of the spouse;
- Legal separation, divorce or annulment;
- Reduction of hours of employment;
- Employer contributions toward a health plan were terminated; or
- A child no longer qualifies for coverage as a child under another health plan.

You (if you are an eligible student as defined above), your Spouse or Child can also enroll 60 days from exhaustion of your COBRA or continuation coverage or if you (if you are an eligible student as defined above) become a Dependent through marriage, birth, adoption or placement for adoption. We must receive notice and premium payment within 60 days of the loss of coverage.

The effective date of your coverage will depend on when we receive your application. If your application is received between the first and fifteenth day of the month, your coverage will begin on the first day of the following month. If your application is received between the sixteenth day and the last day of the month, your coverage will begin on the first day of the second month. In addition, you (if you are an eligible student as defined above), your spouse or child can also enroll for coverage within 60 days of losing (or gaining) eligibility for Medicaid or a state child health plan. We must receive notice and premium payment within 60 days of one of these events. The effective date of your coverage will depend on when We receive Your application. If your application is received between the first and fifteenth day of the month, your coverage will begin on the first day of the following month. If your application is received between the sixteenth day and the last day of the month, your coverage will begin on the first day of the second month.

Medicare Eligibility Notice

You are not eligible to enroll in the student health plan if you have Medicare at the time of enrollment in this student plan. The plan does not provide coverage for people who have Medicare.

In-network Provider Network

Aetna Student Health offers Aetna's broad network of In-network Providers. You can save money by seeing In-network Providers because Aetna has negotiated special rates with them, and because the Plan's benefits are better.

If you need care that is covered under the Plan but not available from an In-network Provider, contact Member Services for assistance at the toll-free number on the back of your ID card. In this situation, Aetna may issue a pre-approval for you to receive the care from an Out-of-network Provider. When a pre-approval is issued by Aetna, the benefit level is the same as for In-network Providers.

Precertification

You need pre-approval from us for some eligible health services. Pre-approval is also called precertification. Your innetwork physician is responsible for obtaining any necessary precertification before you get the care. When you go to an out-of-network provider, it is your responsibility to obtain precertification from us for any services and supplies on the precertification list. If you do not precertify when required, up to a \$500 penalty for each type of eligible health service that was not precertified. Precertification Call

Precertification should be secured within the timeframes specified below. To obtain precertification, call Member Precertification should be secured within the timeframes specified below. To obtain precertification, call Member Services at the toll-free number on your ID card. You, your physician or the facility must call us within these timelines:

Non-emergency admissions	Call at least 14 days before the date you are scheduled to be admitted.
Emergency admission	Call within 48 hours or as soon as reasonably possible after you have been admitted.
Urgent admission	Call before you are scheduled to be admitted.
Outpatient non-emergency medical services	Call at least 14 days before the care is provided, or the treatment is scheduled

An urgent admission is a hospital admission by a physician due to the onset of or change in an illness, the diagnosis of an illness, or an injury.

We will provide a written notification to you and your physician of the precertification decision, where required by state law. If your precertified services are approved, the approval is valid for 30 days as long as you remain enrolled in the plan.

Coordination of Benefits (COB)

Some people have health coverage under more than one health plan. If you do, we will work together with your other plan(s) to decide how much each plan pays. This is called coordination of benefits (COB). A complete description of the Coordination of Benefits provision is contained in the certificate issued to you.

The Plan excludes coverage for certain services and has limitations on the amounts it will pay. - As out-of-network providers do not have a contract with us the provider may not accept payment of your cost share, (copayment/coinsurance), as payment in full. You may receive a bill for the difference between the amount billed by the provider and the amount paid by this plan. If the provider bills you for an amount above your cost share, you are not responsible for paying that amount. You should send the bill to the address listed on the back of your ID card, and we will resolve any payment dispute with the provider over that amount. Make sure the ID card number is on the bill.
- A separate hospital emergency room copayment/coinsurance will apply for each visit to an emergency room.

- If you are admitted to a hospital as an inpatient right after a visit to an emergency room, your emergency room copayment/coinsurance will be waived and your inpatient copayment/coinsurance will apply.

Blood, blood plasma, synthetic blood, blood derivatives or substitutes

Examples of these are:

- The provision of donated blood to the hospital, other than blood derived clotting factors
- Any related services for donated blood including processing, storage or replacement expenses
- The service of blood donors, including yourself, apheresis or plasmapheresis

The blood you donate for your own use, excluding administration and processing expenses and except where described in the *Eligible health services and exclusions – Transplant services* section

Clinical trial therapies (experimental or investigational)

 Your plan does not cover clinical trial therapies (experimental or investigational), except as described in the Eligible health services and exclusions- Clinical trial therapies (experimental or investigational) section in the certificate

Cornea or cartilage transplants

- Cornea (corneal graft with amniotic membrane)
- Cartilage (autologous chondrocyte implant or osteochondral allograft or autograft) transplants

Cosmetic services and plastic surgery

 Any treatment, surgery (cosmetic or plastic), service or supply to alter, improve or enhance the shape or appearance of the body.

This exclusion does not apply to:

- Surgery after an accidental injury when performed as soon as medically feasible. (Injuries that occur during medical treatments are not considered accidental injuries even if unplanned or unexpected.)
- Coverage that may be provided under the Eligible health services and exclusions Gender affirming treatment section.

Court-ordered services and supplies

Court-ordered testing or care unless medically necessary

Custodial care

Services and supplies meant to help you with activities of daily living or other personal needs. Examples of these are:

- Routine patient care such as changing dressings, periodic turning and positioning in bed
- Administering oral medications
- Care of a stable tracheostomy (including intermittent suctioning)
- Care of a stable colostomy/ileostomy
- Care of stable gastrostomy/jejunostomy/nasogastric tube (intermittent or continuous) feedings
- Care of a bladder catheter (including emptying/changing containers and clamping tubing)
- Watching or protecting you
- Respite care except in connection with hospice care, adult (or child) day care, or convalescent care
- Institutional care. This includes room and board for rest cures, adult day care and convalescent care
- Help with walking, grooming, bathing, dressing, getting in or out of bed, toileting, eating or preparing foods
- Any other services that a person without medical or paramedical training could be trained to perform
- Any service that can be performed by a person without any medical or paramedical training

This exclusion does not apply to medically necessary treatment of mental health disorders and substance use disorders.

Dental care for adults

- Dental services for adults including services related to:
 - The care, filling, removal or replacement of teeth and treatment of injuries to or diseases of the teeth
 - Dental services related to the gums
 - Apicoectomy (dental root resection)
 - Orthodontics
 - Root canal treatment
 - Soft tissue impactions
 - Alveolectomy
 - Augmentation and vestibuloplasty treatment of periodontal disease
 - False teeth
 - Prosthetic restoration of dental implants
 - Dental implants

This exception does not include removal of bony impacted teeth, bone fractures, removal of tumors, and odontogenic cysts.

Educational services

Examples of these services that are non-medical and are not medically necessary to treat mental health conditions or substance use disorders are:

- Any service or supply for education, training or retraining services or testing, except where described in the
 Eligible health services and exclusions Diabetic services and supplies (including equipment and training) section.
 This includes:
 - Special education

- Remedial education
- Job training
- Job hardening programs
- Educational services, schooling or any such related or similar program

Examinations

Any health or dental examinations needed:

- Because a third party requires the exam. Examples are, examinations to get or keep a job, or examinations required under a labor agreement or other contract
- Because a law requires it
- To buy insurance or to get or keep a license
- To travel
- To go to a school, camp, or sporting event, or to join in a sport or other recreational activity

Experimental or investigational

• Experimental or investigational drugs, devices, treatments or procedures unless otherwise covered under clinical trial therapies (experimental or investigational) or covered under clinical trials (routine patient costs). See the *Eligible health services and exclusions – Other services* section in the certificate.

Facility charges

For care, services or supplies provided in:

- Rest homes
- Assisted living facilities
- Similar institutions serving as a persons' main residence or providing mainly custodial or rest care
- Health resorts
- Spas or sanitariums
- Infirmaries at schools, colleges, or camps

Felony

Services and supplies that you receive as a result of an injury due to your commission of a felony

Gene-based, cellular and other innovative therapies (GCIT)

The following are not eligible health services unless you receive prior written approval from us:

- GCIT services received at a facility or with a provider that is not a GCIT-designated facility/provider.
- All associated services when GCIT services are not covered. Examples include infusion, laboratory, radiology, anesthesia, and nursing services.

Please refer to the Medical necessity section.

Genetic care

Any treatment, device, drug, service or supply to alter the body's genes, genetic make-up, or the
expression of the body's genes except for the correction of congenital birth defects

Growth/Height care

- A treatment, device, service or supply to increase or decrease height or alter the rate of growth
- Surgical procedures and devices to stimulate growth

Incidental surgeries

• Charges made by a physician for incidental surgeries. These are non-medically necessary surgeries performed during the same procedure as a medically necessary surgery.

Judgment or settlement

• Services and supplies for the treatment of an injury or illness to the extent that payment is made as a judgment or settlement by any person deemed responsible for the injury or illness (or their insurers)

Medical supplies - outpatient disposable

- Any outpatient disposable supply or device. Examples of these are:
 - Sheaths
 - Bags
 - Elastic garments
 - Support hose
 - Bandages
 - Bedpans
 - Splints
 - Neck braces
 - Compresses
 - Other devices not intended for reuse by another patient

Non-U.S. citizen

• Services and supplies received by a **covered person** (who is not a United States citizen) within the **covered person's** home country but only if the home country has a socialized medicine program, except as covered in the *Eligible health services under your plan – Emergency services and urgent care section*

Other primary payer

Payment for a portion of the charge that Medicare or another party pays for as the primary payer

Outpatient prescription or non-prescription drugs and medicines

Outpatient prescription drugs or non-prescription drugs and medicines provided by the policyholder

Personal care, comfort or convenience items

Any service or supply primarily for your convenience and personal comfort or that of a third party

Private duty nursing

School health services

- Services and supplies normally provided without charge by the policyholder's:
 - School health services
 - Infirmary
 - Hospital
 - Pharmacy or

by health professionals who

- Are employed by
- Are Affiliated with
- Have an agreement or arrangement with, or

- Are otherwise designated by

the policyholder.

Services not permitted by law

• Some laws restrict the range of health care services a **provider** may perform under certain circumstances or in a particular state. When this happens, the services are not covered by the plan.

Services provided by a family member

 Services provided by a spouse, domestic partner, civil union partner parent, child, step-child, brother, sister, in-law or any household member

Sexual dysfunction and enhancement

- Any treatment, service, or supply to treat sexual dysfunction, enhance sexual performance or increase sexual desire, including:
 - Implants, devices or preparations to correct or enhance erectile function or sensitivity
 - Sex therapy, sex counseling, marriage counseling, or other counseling or advisory services

Sinus surgery

• Any services or supplies given by **providers** for non-**medically necessary** sinus surgery except for acute purulent sinusitis

Strength and performance

- Services, devices and supplies that are not **medically necessary**, such as drugs or preparations designed primarily for enhancing your:
 - Strength
 - Physical condition
 - Endurance
 - Physical performance

Students in mental health field

• Any services and supplies provided to a covered student who is specializing in the mental health care field and who receives treatment from a provider as part of their training in that field

Telemedicine

- Services given when you are not present at the same time as the provider
- Services including:
 - Telemedicine kiosks
 - Electronic vital signs monitoring or exchanges, (e.g. Tele-ICU, Tele-stroke)

Therapies and tests

- Hair analysis
- Hypnosis and hypnotherapy
- Massage therapy, except when used as a physical therapy modality
- Sensory or auditory integration therapy

Treatment in a federal, state, or governmental entity

 Any care in a hospital or other facility owned or operated by any federal, state or other governmental entity, except to the extent coverage is required by applicable laws
